The French branch of Sakyadhita was founded in Strasbourg in 2006. In the multilingual border region of Alsace, a special bond with Sakyadhita Germany developed right from the start. Over many years, this connection has grown into a friendly and committed collaboration.

This conference is open to anyone with an interest in Buddhism, women's perspectives in the Dharma and the future of spiritual communities, regardless of their ordination status, gender or Buddhist tradition.

With Ven. Jetsunma Tenzin Palmo, Ven. Martine Batchelor, Dr. Tilmann Borghardt, Ven. Ayya Phalanyani and Ven. Dr. Karma Lekshe Tsomo, internationally experienced voices come together who have been linking Buddhist practice, contemplation, gender equality and social engagement for many years. The presentations are not limited to honoring two decades of commitment to Buddhist women in France and in Europe; they also explore the future of Sakyadhita in Europe, to the power of international solidarity, and to the question of how women in Buddhism today can take up responsibilities with greater courage, increased visibility and as an entirely natural part of society.

Improving visibility doesn't simply happen by itself - it grows where people encourage one another, challenge old stereotypes and forge new paths together.

Questions everyone's asking

- Why do women still take on visible roles of responsibility less often in spiritual communities?
- What internal and external obstacles stand in the way of achieving it?
- How do cultural influences, traditional role models and expectations continue to have an impact today?

- What empowers women to follow their own path with clarity, self-confidence and inner freedom?
- How can men and women work together to establish new forms of equality and collaboration?
